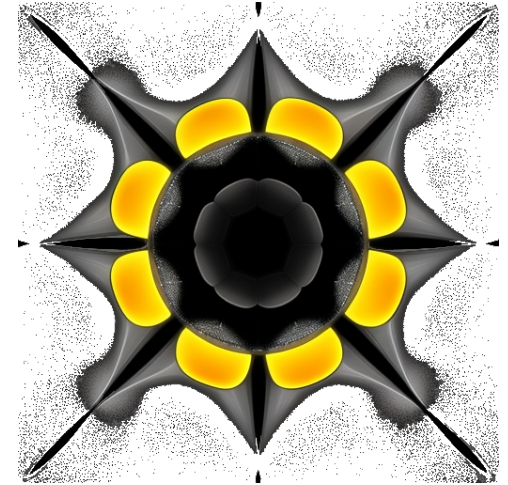


Molecular Sculpture
